Members of the Clark County Board of Health met on Friday, April 13, 1962 at 7:30 p. m.

Minutes of the Previous Meeting read and approved as read.

It was explained by Dr. Adair, the reason for no January meeting, being due to the fact that there were no real important issues to be voted upon.

Regarding the extra weeks pay for Health Department Employees, for working 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ Saturday mornings per year, which had been previously explained to the Board, and who had at the last meeting requested Dr. Adair to investigate policies of other Health Departments in the area; Conclusion- It was moved by Mr. Brummett and seconded by Dr. Regan and carried that employees received this extra weeks vacation or compensatory time, in lieu of working these extra days, and that this vacation be given at the discretion of Dr. Adair.

It was moved by Mr. Jack Hester, seconded by Dr. Goodman and carried; that the old mimeograph machine not being used, be loaned to the Carr Township School.

Dr. Adair explained to the Board the Relationship between the Health Department and the Planning and Zoning Board, regarding the building and septic tank situation. Members were informed how the two organizations were trying to work together for better coverage on septic tank permits.

Announcement was made relative to the Home Nursing Classes being conducted in Henryville and at the /Red Cross, by Mrs. Moss and Miss Belver. The Board gave its unanimous approval of the continuance of these classes, but did not approve of becoming involved in employing an extra health nurse to serve the public, as both Dr. Adair and the Board deemed this to be a Governmental Affair.

It was announced that Mrs. Moss had a new position with Civil Defense, having been appointed by Dr. Eli Goodman

Dr. Adair discussed with the Board the various new sewer lines that were being installed around Clark County. Colonial Hotel, Jack Jacots and the Prentice Subdivisions.

On Motion by Dr. Goodman, seconded by Dr. Bower, it was agreed that information contained in future annual reports of the Health Department, be given to all Newspapers.

MEETING OF THE CLARK COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT WAS HELD ON
FRIDAY, JULY 27, 1962 at 7:30 P. M.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED AS READ.

SPECIAL GUESTS AT THE MEETING INCLUDED DR. PURLEE, DR. MUNICH OF THE CLARK COUNTY FLUORIDE PROGRAM AND MRS. HELEN SCHEIBNER, HEALTH CONSULTANT FROM THE INDIANA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH.

DR. PURLEE EXPLAINED THE FLUORIDE PROGRAM AND READ THE PURPOSES AND INTENTS OF THE OUTLINE. MRS. SCHEIBNER EXPLAINED WHAT HAD BEEN DONE IN OTHER COUNTIES, i. e. FLOYD AND HARRISON AND BRIEFED THE BOARD ON HOW THIS MATTER COULD BE HANDLED THROUGH THE AUDITOR AND TREASURER OF CLARK COUNTY, WITH NO COST TO THE COUNTY.

MONIES TO BE COLLECTED FROM CHILDREN RECEIVING THIS TREATMENT TO BE COLLECTED AND BANKED, THEN TURNED OVER TO THE CLARK COUNTY TREASURER, TO BE DISBURSED BY THE AUDITOR FOR PAYMENT TO A DENTAL HYGEANIST. THIS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET.

IN CONCLUSION DR. ADAIR ASKED DR. REGAN TO MAKE THE SUGGESTION THAT MRS. SCHEIBNER TALK THE PLAN OF THE PROGRAM OVER WITH THE COUNTY ATTORNEY AND COUNTY AUDITOR. NO VOTE WAS TAKEN ON THIS MATTER, AS THE BOARD FELT IT WOULD BE BETTER TO WAIT UNTIL MRS. SCHEIBNER HAD THIS MEETING AND SEE THE REACTION OF THE ABOVE NAMED PERSONS. MRS. SCHEIBNER WAS REQUESTED BY THE BOARD TO REVISE THE AGREEMENT AND TO TAKE IT- ALONG WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY FOR HIS OPINION.

THE BUDGET FOR THE COMING YEAR OF 1963 WAS DISCUSSED IN DETAIL AND DR. ADAIR EXPLAINED THE DIFFICULTY ENCOUNTERED IN OPERATING THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT WITH THE LIMITED AMOUNT ALLOCATED FOR MILEAGE FOR TWO SANITARIANS, TWO PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES AND THE SHORTAGE WE MIGHT ENCOUNTER IN NOT HAVING SUFFICIENT FUNDS IN SEVERAL CATEGORIES IN THE PRESENT BUDGET, NAMELY TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH.

MRS. EFFIE MOSS AND MISS MARIE BELVER, PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES EACH OUTLINED THE DETAILS OF THEIR WORK AND TOLD OF THE INCREASE IN NEW SERVICES AND POINTED OUT THE SALARIES OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES IN OTHER AGENCIES WITH COMPARABLE POPULATION'S ALSO THOSE WITH LESS. IN CONCLUSION ASKED THAT THE BOARD GIVE SOME CONSIDERATION TO AN INCREASE IN THEIR SALARIES, IN VIEW OF THE LENGTH OF SERVICE, PAST EDUCATION AND INCREASED SERVICES AND DUTIES.

DR. AD AIR ALSO ASKED THE BOARD TO GIVE THE SAME CONSIDERATION TO THE SALARY OF ARTHUR REICHLER, SANITARIAN, IN ORDER TO BRING HIS SALARY UP TO \$4,800. which is THE AMOUNT BEING RECEIVED BY THE OTHER SANITARIAN MR. JOSEPH COOMBS.

IT WAS THE UNANIMOUS FEELING OF THE BOARD, THAT AN INCREASE OF \$400.00 PER ANNUM FOR BOTH MRS. MOSS AND MISS BELVER, BOTH REGISTERED NURSES, BE INCLUDED IN THE 1963 BUDGET, AS WELL AS THE PROPOSED INCREASE FOR MR. REICHLER.

WERE THIS TO BE APPROVED, IT WOULD BRING BOTH MRS. EFFIE MOSS RN AND MISS MARIE

BELVER, R. N. NEARLY UP TO THE STANDARD BRACKET OF \$4,800.00. amount RECOMMENDED BY THE INDIANA STATE NURSES' ASSOCIATION.

DR. ADAIR, ALONG WITH MR. ARTHUR REICHEL, DISCUSSED AT LENGTH, THE WATER SITUATION AT THE JEFFERSONVILLE ELKS CLUB AND THE BLASTING OF A SEPTIC TANK ON UTICA PIKE; STATING THAT THE DISTRICT ENGINEER AT INDIANAPOLIS, HAD BEEN CONTACTED TO HELP SOLVE THIS PROBLEM.

IT WAS MOVED BY MR. HESTER AND SECONDED BY DR. BOWER THAT THE JEFFERSONVILLE ELKS CLUB CEASE AND DESIST FROM USING WATER FROM THE CONTAMINATED WELLS ON THEIR PROPERTY.

MATTER OF A TATOO ARTIST NOW LOCATED IN JEFFERSONVILLE, STEMMING OUT OF COMPLAINTS TO THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT FROM PARENTS AND OFFICERS AT THE IRELAND GENERAL HOSPITAL, FT. KNOX, KENTUCKY, WAS DISCUSSED.

THE BOARD'S DECISION WAS, TO INVESTIGATE WHAT ACTION WAS TAKEN IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY AND FOLLOW THE SAME PROCEDURE. MOTION BY MR. BRUMMETT, SECONDED BY MR. HESTER AND CARRIED.

MEETING OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT FRIDAY OCTOBER 9, 1962

Members of the Clark County Board of Health, met on Friday, October 9, 1962 at 7:30 P. M.

PRESENT

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

DR. ADAIR READ LETTER TO THE BOARD FROM MR. JAMES MCCOY, INDIANA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH, INDIANAPOLIS, REGARDING THE FINANCING OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT; IN WHICH HE LISTED COMPARATIVE COUNTY COSTS IN OTHER COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENTS, WHICH SHOWED THE CLARK COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAD THE LOWEST OPERATING COST OF ANY COUNTY.

DR. ADAIR REQUESTED PERMISSION OF THE BOARD TO APPROACH THE NEW COUNTY COUNCIL AFTER THE FIRST OF THE YEAR, TO TRY AND ESTABLISH OUR HEALTH, AS PER MR. MCCOY'S LETTER: OR HAVE THE NEW COUNCIL MEET WITH THE BOARD IF POSSIBLE. PERMISSION GRANTED.

THE BUDGET FOR 1963 WAS DISCUSSED WITH THE BOARD AT LENGTH, IN WHICH DR. ADAIR POINTED OUT HIS REQUESTS FOR RAISES FOR THE TWO PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES AND MR. REICHLER, TO BRING THEIR SALARIES UP TO STANDARDS OF OTHER HEALTH DEPARTMENTS. ALSO DISCUSSED THE SHORTAGES IN OTHER CATEGORIES AND CLASSIFICATIONS, IN WHICH WE ALWAYS RAN SHORT.

MATTER OF A TYPHOID CASE IN CLARK COUNTY WAS DISCUSSED BY DR. ADAIR, WHO TOLD THE BOARD THAT DR. MARSHALL AND MR. BRAZZO, BOTH OF THE INDIANA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH REPORTED THAT THEY WERE PROCESSING THE STOOL CULTURES OF EACH PERSON IN THESE THREE FAMILIES AND STATED THAT ALL PERSONS HAD BEEN GIVEN INSTRUCTIONS NOT TO HANDLE FOOD PUBLICLY AND THAT THEY WERE TO BOIL ALL DRINKING WATER. THE BOARD FELT THAT EVERYTHING HAD BEEN DONE THAT COULD HAVE BEEN DONE IN THIS CASE.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS WAS HELD AND MR. RUSSELL ALLEN WAS UNANAMOUSLY ELECTED PRESIDENT AND DR. ELI GOODMAN, VICE-PRESIDENT.

THE SABIN ORAL CAMPAIGN WAS DISCUSSED WITH THE BOARD AND DR. ADAIR EXPRESSED HIS FEELINGS IN THIS MATTER.

REGARDING THE TATTOO ARTIST, "ACE DIAMOND", DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD THAT THE PROSECUTOR WAS AWAITING A LETTER FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, TO SEE IF THERE WAS ANY LAW EXISTING, THAT COULD BE ENFORCED, TO CLOSE THIS MAN UP. ON MOTION BY DR. BOWER, SECONDED BY DR. REGAN AND CARRIED, IT WAS AGREED THAT DR. ADAIR TAKE WHATEVER ACTION HE DEEMED NECESSARY.
